Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to repeal Amendment 709 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901; to reestablish the Education Trust Fund Rainy Day Account within the Alabama Trust Fund; and to establish the General Fund Rainy Day Account within the Alabama Trust Fund. (Proposed by Act No. 2008-508)

(Proposed by Act No. 2007-360)

(Proposed by Act No. 2008-285)

(Proposed by Act No. 2008-288)
