STATE DEMOCRATIC EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF ALABAMA
MINUTES OF MEETING OF SUBCOMMITTEE
Held in the Office of the Secretary of State on Friday, June 11, 2010
State Capitol Building, Montgomery, Alabama

The Subcommittee of the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama, which said Subcommittee was duly appointed by and under authority of the Rules of the Democratic Party for the purpose of supervising the holding of the Democratic Primary Election ordered in and by said resolution of the State Democratic Executive Committee to be held in the State of Alabama, including the canvassing of and the declaration of the result of said Primary Election, and the certification of the nominees (and said Subcommittee being, under said rules so adopted by said State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama, vested with all of the authority to perform, and being instructed to perform all of the duties required by law of the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama in said Primary Election, except the duties reposed by law on the Chair), met at the State Capitol Building in Montgomery, Alabama, at eleven o'clock a.m., on Friday, June 11, 2010, in accordance with provisions of 17-13-17 as amended, of the Code of Ala., 1975.

Dr. Joe L. Reed, presided as Chair of the Subcommittee to canvass the returns of the Democratic Primary Election held on June 1, 2010, and called the meeting to order, with the following members present:

Jim Spearman Janet May Ann Hubbard Brannon Walden

The Chair thereupon declared that a quorum of said Subcommittee was present and the meeting was declared open for the transaction of business.

The Chair then stated that the tabulation of the vote in the Democratic Primary Election held in the State of Alabama on Tuesday, June 1, 2010, except as to county offices, was made by the State Democratic Executive Committee staff of Montgomery, Alabama.

On motion of Jim Spearman duly seconded by Ann Hubbard the tabulation of such votes so made and compiled by the State Democratic Executive Committee staff was adopted and accepted as correct by said Subcommittee.

Thereupon the following resolution was offered by Janet May and duly seconded by Jim Spearman.

“BE IT RESOLVED by the Subcommittee of the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama, in meeting assembled in the office of the Secretary of State at the State Capitol in Montgomery, Alabama, at 11:00 a.m., on this the 11th day of June, 2010, being the Friday 10 days following the Democratic Primary Election in the State of Alabama on June 1, 2010, as follows:

“That the said Subcommittee does now receive and tabulate the returns from said Democratic Primary Election, and does now publicly declare that result of said Primary Election as to all offices, except county offices, to be shown on the Tabulation of Returns attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

“BE IT RESOLVED by the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama, acting through the Subcommittee duly authorized and appointed for that purpose, that the persons, opposite whose name on the attached Tabulation of Returns the word “nominated” appears, are respectively duly nominated to the respective offices as reflected by the said Tabulation, each of them having received in said first

Primary Election held on June 1, 2010, a majority of the votes cast for office for which he or she was a candidate.

“BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that those candidates who duly qualified in said Democratic Primary but had no opposition, a list of whom was heretofore filed with the Secretary of State, are hereby declared duly nominated.

The above and foregoing resolution was thereupon put to a vote and was unanimously adopted by said Subcommittee.

Thereupon the following resolution was offered by Brannon Walden and duly seconded by Ann Hubbert.

“WHEREAS in the Democratic Primary Election held in the State of Alabama on Tuesday, June 1, 2010, no candidate for the nomination of certain offices received a majority of the votes cast for said offices in the first Primary, and it is necessary for the candidates opposite whose name the word “runoff” appears to be voted on in the second Primary Election called to be held in the State of Alabama on Tuesday, July 13, 2010.


“NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama, acting through said above mentioned Subcommittee, duly authorized and appointed for that purpose, that the persons, who were candidates in the Democratic Primary Election held in the State of Alabama on Tuesday, June 1, 2010, and opposite whose name the word “runoff” appears are the candidates entitled to be voted for in the second Democratic Primary Election called to be held in the State of Alabama on Tuesday, July 13, 2010, and that the Chair of the State Democratic Executive Committee of Alabama be, and he hereby is, authorized, empowered, instructed, and directed to certify to the Secretary of State of Alabama as the candidates who are to be voted for in the Second Primary Election to be held on Tuesday, July 13, 2010.

Thereupon the following resolution was offered by Janet May and duly seconded by Jim Spearman.



Thereupon, on motion duly made and seconded, the meeting adjourned.






